UCP hires highly qualified and experienced faculty with the aim to attract bright scholars and professionals and to deliver quality education following its tradition. The Department is designed to furnish a stimulating academic environment for scholars and students in their pursuit of learning. Its goal is to facilitate students by enhancing their knowledge and achieve academic excellence so they can pursue their educational and professional dreams. This department aims to produce graduates with an understanding of institutions, practices, and relations that constitute public life and developing modes of inquiry that promote citizenship, and ways to succeed in the global world.

Department of **Economics**

The critical role of the subject of Economics and economists in identifying and suggesting remedial measures for multiple problems hindering the socio-economic growth of a society is well recognized not only in Pakistan but also all over the world. At its present stage of development, Pakistan is facing multiple constraints on the way of economic growth due to a lack of professionals having command over knowledge and its application in various areas of development, policy making, implementation and evaluation. Even teaching, research and normal operations of the various institutions in the public and private sectors suffer due to inadequacy of trained human resources. To fill this gap, we have taken the initiative to train the students with the cutting-edge knowledge in economics through undergraduate and graduate studies in economics. These students upon graduation will be ready to take jobs in the public and private sectors and also can start their own businesses and consultancies in their areas of specialization.

Initially the department of Economics was established for teaching the subjects of Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Economic Analysis and Managerial Economics to support the BBA and MBA programs of Faculty of Management Sciences. In pursuance of our long-term vision, BS Economics and Finance program was launched in Fall 2011 by FoHSS. A separate and independent Economics Department was established to offer various degrees in the said subjects. To further strengthen the BS Economics program, the department was reoriented to offer specializations in Finance as well as Data Analytics with the objective to prepare students to be warmly accepted in public and private sectors, specifically, banking and development sectors in the country and abroad. The MS Program was started in Fall 2013 to be followed by PhD in later semesters. So far, seven MS students have successfully completed their degrees and other seven students are working on their theses. MS theses are evaluated by the experts in the respective fields and quality of the research work is ensured rigorously.

Department of **General Education**

The Department of General Education is a key department not only for the Faculty of Humanities and Social sciences but it has a vital role to play for the entire university. Introduction

The Department of Politics and International Relations (P&IR) is designed to furnish a stimulating academic environment for scholars and students in their pursuit of learning. Its goals are to facilitate students in enhancing their knowledge, achieving academic excellence and pursuing their educational and professional goals. UCP has developed various institutional linkages to ensure that P&IR's graduating Alumni are provided with a wide range of opportunities to meet these goals.

Rationale of the Program

BS International Relations (IR) program requires and encourages students to develop a multi-disciplinary perspective on regional and global issues. By developing reading, writing, research, presentation, and analytical skills of students, this program aims to prepare students for careers in business, government, education, and the non-profit sector as well as further studies in related disciplines.

Program Objectives

This undergraduate program aims to prepare its students to gain deeper knowledge of the subject as well as an ability to analyze any given situation and draw more educated conclusions. It is designed by keeping in view the following key objectives:

1. The graduates who complete this program should have a sound and broad knowledge of the subject of International Relations. For this purpose, this intensive and extensive program spreads over 4-Years.
2. The program would familiarize students with emerging trends in the disciplines of Political Science and International Relations.
3. Along with the knowledge of the subject, students should also have a broader view of other disciplines of social and physical sciences. It will enable them to grasp the interaction of this subject with other branches of knowledge and strengthen their understanding of states and societies across the globe.
4. The graduates are to be equipped with essential tools and techniques of research to enable them to analyze emerging situations and issues. They will be prepared to comprehend multifaceted issues of contemporary domestic and world politics as well as foreign policy processes.

5. The program graduates would be equipped to establish and develop a viable and forceful link between theory, concepts, and practices in the field.

Teaching methods

Contemporary and workable teaching methods shall be used during the study of the subject of International Relations at the BS level.

1. Course outlines and the reading material will be provided to students. UCP provides full support to the students and teachers in getting reading material.
2. HEC guidelines as well as national and international practices are followed in the development of each course in this program.
3. Seminars, workshops, and simulations on national and international issues will be organized by the Department according to the available facilities and resources.
4. Students would be provided with the opportunity visit and observe various organizations related to various national and international political and economic dynamics.

- At 45% marks in Intermediate or equivalent
- All applicants must pass UCP Admission Test

d) Field Experience/Internship:

A capstone project is multifaceted body of work that serves as a culminating academic and intellectual experience for students. Political Science

Introduction

Political Science is the systematic study of how individuals and institutions exercise and resist power, and how nations and communities are governed. Studies in Political Science focus on the theory, evolution, and practice of government and politics at the local, state, national, and international levels. Recognizing the importance of the subject and the need for trained professionals in the field, the University of Central Punjab (UCP) is introducing an undergraduate program in Political Science. The University of Central Punjab aims to produce graduates with an understanding of institutions, practices, and relations that constitute public life and develop modes of inquiry that promote citizenship. UCP has highly qualified core faculty members to teach Political Science, and expert teachers are available throughout the University who specializes in the teaching of compulsory and Interdisciplinary courses.

Rationale of the Program

BS in Political Science provides education to those whose primary interest is a professional career in Governance and Administration in either the public or private sector. Students would find their degrees useful for entrance into federal, provincial and local government service, working for international organizations, careers in social work, in media and journalism, in academia and even in career politics. The design of the program would help prepare students to be competitive for Governmental Agencies, Nongovernmental Organizations, and Research and Academic Organizations. UCP offers career support and advice and assist students in their study choices. Through internship programs, students would gain acumen, beneficial work experience and transferable skills giving them a competitive advantage in a fast-paced working environment.

Program Objectives

The UCP views the study of Politics as organizing one's observations and knowledge of an ever-changing state structure and world in a coherent, structured and systematic way as well as about being equipped with the methodological tools for understanding and, most importantly, explaining complex social and political phenomena. Majoring in Political Science at the UCP provides students with:

- A broad education in the social sciences and humanities.
- The foundations of citizenship and the capacity to participate effectively in local, national, and international politics.
- Understanding, problem-solving and communication skills for careers in government, politics, law, and teaching.
- Strong preparation for study of political Science at the graduate level.

BS Political Science is a four-year, eight semester course which combines intellectually rigorous training in theoretical and conceptual approaches to politics with the study of the recent history of politics in the country and worldwide, as well as providing methodological training and personalized guidance. The course work enables a thorough mastery of the major facts, methodologies and perspectives in the field, as well as to develop research skills. The Program engages and enlightens undergraduate and graduate students, colleagues, and fellow citizens about the theory and practice of politics. Pertinent Scholars, Academicians, Professionals, Journalists, and Researchers will be invited as guest speakers to deliver talks in classes, and hold seminars in order to increase the knowledge of the students.

Admission Requirements

- Intermediate (FA/F.Sc.) or equivalent securing at least 45% marks in aggregate
- All applicants must pass the UCP Admission Test

- Securing the final Cumulative Grade Point Average of not less than 2.00/4.00

Program Duration

This is four-year degree program comprising of 8 semesters. There is a fall and a spring semester in each year. The summer semester is utilized for deficiency courses. The maximum duration to complete the BS program is 7 years.
