

Law Clinic

Keeping up with the contemporary standards of legal education, the Law Clinic Program at UCP Faculty of Law bears two-fold responsibility; firstly, to provide pro bono legal services to the underprivileged community members, and secondly, to provide students with a hands-on learning experience. To meet these ends, FoL maintains a proper infrastructure which comprises a Law Clinic office, a Law Clinic Secretary Office and a Conference Room. The UCP Moot Court Room provides state-of-the-art amenities to develop the advocacy skills of the students.

Five-Level Advocacy Skills Courses

To provide its students with hands-on learning experience and to hone their advocacy skills, FoL has made advocacy skills courses a regular feature of its scheme of studies. One advocacy skills course is offered to students per year on a specific area of legal practice/Training.

Peace and Mediation Center

The Peace Center of the Faculty of Law is established to promote peace education. It intends to address the subject matter through both academic courses and practical application and exploration. The vital part of the goal achievement process at the Peace Center is to conduct research on issues of peace at personal, national and global levels.

International Conference

Every year, the Faculty of Law organizes the annual International Conference on contemporary issues. This year's conference was held on 17th & 18th May 2023 with the theme "Law Tech and Legal Education in Pakistan". The keynote speakers for the conference included Professor Dr. Hadia Awan (Dean Faculty of Law, UCP), Prof. Nick James, Executive Dean, Faculty of Law, Bond University, Australia, Prof. Guido Noto La Diega, Martin-Flynn Global Law Professor, University of Connecticut, US Associate Professor, University of Stirling, UK, Hon. A. D. Dory Reiling, Ex-Judge, Amsterdam District Court, Netherlands, Lead Reporter on the European Law Institute's project on digitalization of Civil Justice in Europe, Mr. Francesco Contini, Research

director at the Legal Informatics and Justice Systems Institute, Italy and Mr. Zaid Hamzah, Data & Al Practitioner, Executive Education Fellow, National University of Singapore. Prof. Lyria Bennet Moses, Associate Dean (Research), Faculty of Law and Justice, University of New South Wales, Australia, Dr. Awaludin Marwan, CEO, HeyLaw, Indonesia, Dr. Péter Mezei, Professor of law at the University of Szeged, Hungary, Prof. Burkhard Schafer, Professor for Computational Legal Theory, University of Edinburgh, UK, Mr. Aftab Sohail, Founder Legal Squad Pvt. Ltd, CEO Logic Squad Pvt. Ltd. Talks were delivered by MR. Taimur Ahmed Malik, CEO courting the law, Mr. Rajarman Senthilkumar, Al & XR expert, Singapore and Barrister Ahmed Hassan on digital law Platform, Musheer, Pakistan. Scholars from Malaysia, Tunisia and Pakistan presented their research papers.

Legislative Theater

Each year, FoL holds a legislative theatre on various social issues that stand in need of legislation. This year's legislative theatre was held on 23rd June, under the theme 'Mata'a ul Talaq' (post-divorce maintenance). The panel members represented the legal fraternity, legislatures, United Nations and civil society. The story performed in legislative theatre illustrated the miseries of divorced women. The story highlighted the need to have a legal framework for Mata'a ul Talaq through the deliberations of the 'metabolizing cell' voted by the audience. The resolution is to be tabled in the legislative assemblies of Pakistan with the help of members of metabolizing cells soon.

Legal Health Camp

Legal Health Camp is part of pro bono services offered by FoL Law Clinic. Practitioners from various legal fields are invited to tender advice to the UCP community. This year, Legal Health Camp was held on the 13th of April. Twenty Law offices provided legal advice in matters related to Family laws, Civil laws, Taxation laws, Intellectual Property laws, Cyber laws, Labor laws, Property Laws, Consumer laws, Criminal laws, Corporate laws, Revenue laws, and laws related to Guardians and wards.

- All applicants are required to pass the UCP Admission Test with a 50% score or the GRE/HAT General/equivalent test with a passing score of 50% followed by an interview by the Graduate Admission Committee

Introduction of LL.M Program

LL.M (Master of Laws) is a globally recognized program polishing the research skills of law professionals. Traditionally, the program had been valued for law academics. However, the global inclusion of new domains in law practice, including Cyber-Laws and Security, Intellectual Property, Legal Tech, forensic sciences, and electronic devices, has opened new vistas to the law profession. These openings require specialized and continuous grooming of the law professional in all these and other connected fields. That is the reason LL. M program has gained a cutting-edge for law academics and practicing lawyers.

To groom and harness the skills of research, innovations, collaborations, and transfer of interdisciplinary knowledge between law academics, law professionals and non-law professionals to make them able to fill the gaps of the competitive markets nationally and globally.

Outline & Roadmap of LL.M

The program consists of 30 Credit Hours as per the following distribution in line with HEC Policies. Course Work – 24 CH in total through 8 x courses (each of 3 CH) in all comprising, 1 compulsory course of Research Methodology and 7 courses out of electives. Thesis/ Dissertation 6 CH. The minimum and maximum period for completion of LL. M is 2-4 years. The student will have to complete 8 courses (24 credit hours) in three semesters and will have to register for the thesis in the fourth semester.
