group discussions, participants gained valuable insights into:





UCP x PHVACR MOU










UCP x INTI Malaysia MOU

FOMS x Meezan Bank









Mid-Point Meeting of Student Pedagogy Partnership Program (Fall 2024)






Hands-on Training on Law Office Research



Publication of 2nd Volume, 1st Issue of UCP-JST




Volume 2, Issue 1 of the UCP Journal of Science and Technology (UCP-JST) has been successfully published. This achievement reflects the collaborative efforts of authors, reviewers, and the editorial team, who have worked tirelessly to ensure the quality of the publication.

Space Research Centre (SRC - UCP) captured its first satellite image from a NOAA Weather Satellite





Electrical Engineering Department students have successfully developed a satellite ground station in the lab, receiving their first satellite image from the NOAA satellite. This achievement was made possible by designing custom VHF antenna systems, including crossdipole, V, inverted V, and quadrifilar helix antennas. Using a software-defined radio (SDR) and GNU Radio, the team captured satellite signals and generated an image of the Central Asia region. This station will support research in areas such as image processing, environmental sciences, weather forecasting, and disaster management. The next phase includes developing S-band antennas for higherresolution images. This project marks a significant milestone in the department's research capabilities, providing students with hands-on experience in satellite communications and signal processing.







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
