Highlight of the Month

The Natural Products Research Network for Eastern & Central Africa NAPRECA Winter School 2024



21st NAPRECA Winter School marked a milestone in advancing natural product research and fostering international collaboration.



Chief Guest, Director General, COMSTECH, Dr. M. Iqbal Chaudhary's keynote address highlighted the critical role of research and capacity building in addressing global challenges.

Pro-Rector, Dr. Hammad Naveed's welcome address, expressed UCP's dedication to promote global research initiatives and support the exploration of natural products for the betterment of humanity. NAPRECA Executive Secretary, Dr. Sameh Abouzid and Dr. Solomon Tesfalidet from Uppsala University, Sweden offered insights into the global impact of natural product research.

An 11-member delegation from various African countries brought incredible diversity and energy to the event, engaging in a transformative journey filled with lectures, hands-on laboratory sessions and workshops.



Dr. Faheem Ahmad Siddiqui's lecture on "Harvesting Nature's Pharmacopoeia: Techniques for Extracting Bioactive Compounds from Plants" captivated the audience with the significance of bioactive compounds in modern medicine, advanced techniques for extracting and analyzing these compounds and the potential of natural products in addressing global health challenges.

On day2, CEO, Dr. Masood Homeopathic Pharmaceuticals, Dr. Muhammad Zubair Qureshi, delivered a keynote address on "Testing of Phytomedicines and Their Legal Regulations". He shed light on the testing protocols, quality control measures, and regulatory challenges in the phytomedicine industry. His expertise highlighted the importance of ensuring the safety and efficacy of natural medicines while addressing the socio-economic potential they hold for regions like Pakistan.



Dr. Faheem Ahmed Siddiqui and Dr. Ayesha Asif led a training session on, "Extracting Potential: Hands-On Methods for Bioactive Compounds from Plants" focusing on cutting-edge techniques for extracting bioactive compounds from plants, gaining invaluable skills and insights into the practical applications of phytochemical research.

Dr. Kagisha Vedaste and Mr. Sauli Lingson Kalinga shared their views of their experience in Pakistan and academic and research facilities at UCP on UCP Radio.



On day 3, Prof. Dr. Sami Khalid from Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Science and Technology, Sudan delivered an online keynote lecture on the topic of Herbal Medicines in Africa – Where we are and the way forward to catch up with the quality assurance technologies.



The NEPRECA delegate along with Dean, FOPS and faculty members visited Masood Pharmaceuticals as part of industry visit in the mobility programme. They were shown a documentary on the 100 years history of Masood Pharmaceuticals followed by a visit to their drug manufacturing facility and quality control labs. COO, Masood Pharmaceuticals, Dr. Shoaib Hakim conducted a hands-on session on the different techniques of Spectroscopic Analysis of Natural Compounds with the delegate in their laboratory. The visit concluded with a working lunch hosted by Masood Pharmaceuticals and presentation of souvenirs to the delegate members.

NAPRECA delegate were provided hands on training on using chromatographic techniques by Dr. M. Asad and Dr. M. Zaman in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences Research Lab where the delegate members learned the cutting-edge research skills in the wet lab setting.

Learning Innovation Centre’s Faculty Townhall

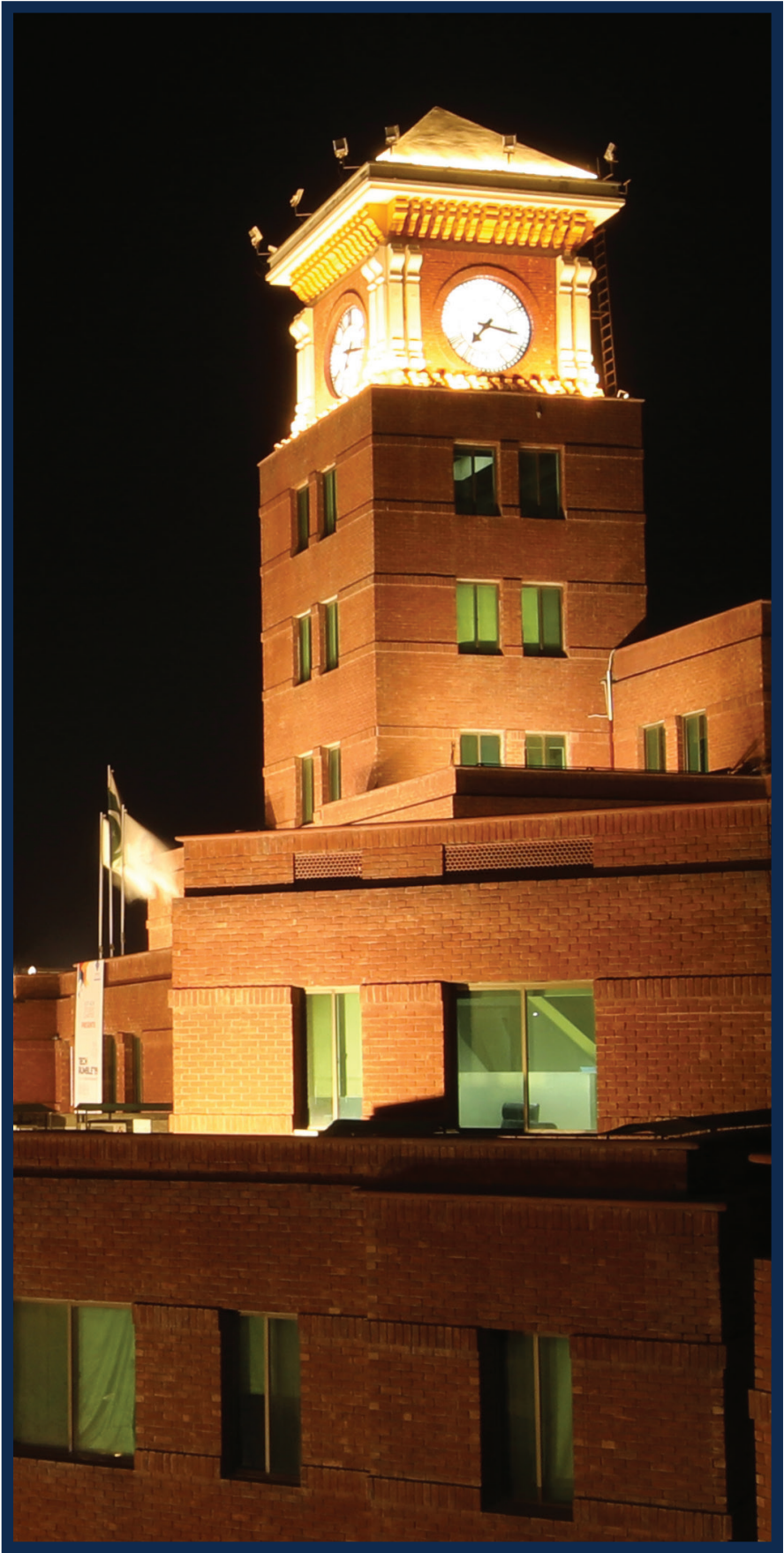

Smog Awareness Session



Human Resource Department in collaboration with a delegation from Evercare Hospital hosted a session on Smog and its prevention. A walk in A-Courtyard was held to raise awareness about the severe smog crisis affecting the region. The air quality index has dangerously exceeded WHO guidelines, causing a rise in respiratory diseases and flu-related coughing. Most educational institutions have been closed, and a “green lockdown” is being observed. The excessive number of cars on the road and high emissions have worsened the situation, particularly for children and the elderly, whose immune systems are weaker. WHO considers an air quality index above 300 to be dangerous, but in Pakistan, it has been exceeding 1000, making it difficult for people to breathe. The walk served as a reminder of the urgent need for stricter enforcement of safety measures and for immediate action to protect public health during these hazardous conditions.

Day 2, Technical Session A continued discussions on Biotechnology, Zoology, and Microbiology and featured insightful presentations. Technical Session B covered Chemistry, Biochemistry, and Food Sciences. It included five invited speakers and eight presentations, with around 60 participants. MS and PhD scholars competed for the Best Presentation award. Technical Session C on Mathematics and Physics brought together nearly 40 scholars for collaborative discussions and presentations. Awards were given for best poster and oral presentations, and the event concluded with a group photo, marking the success of ICEHST-2024.

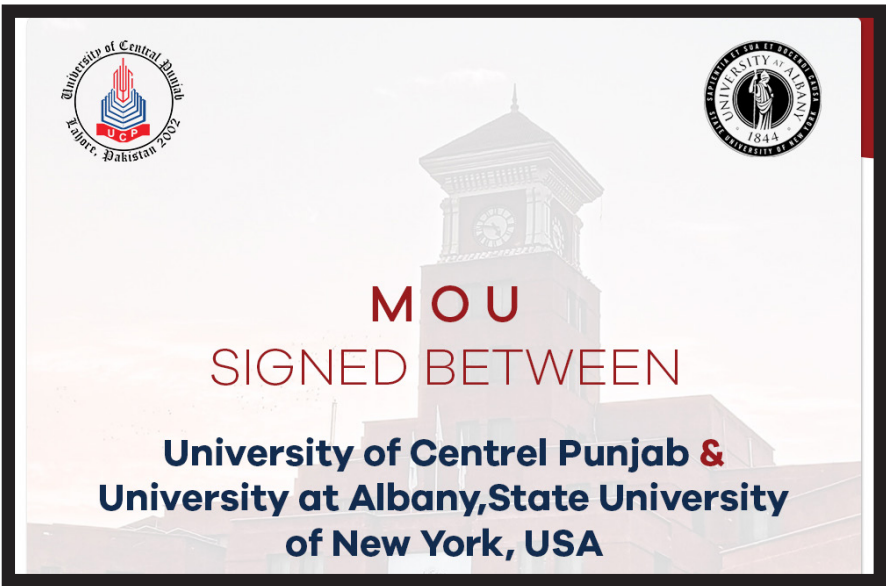
FLL x Center for Culture and Development / Gandhara Resource Center Pakistan MOU

Partnerships

University of Central Punjab Partners with University at Albany on Air Pollution Monitoring Project



University of Central Punjab (UCP) has collaborated with the Department of Environmental Sciences at the University at Albany to extend a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) originally signed in 2022. This MoU, titled “Air Pollution Monitoring of PM2.5 in Lahore to Investigate the Causes of Smog and Its Health Impacts,” addresses one of the most pressing concerns for the residents of Lahore.

The MoU has now been extended for the years 2024-2025, in response to the high air quality index of Lahore. UCP’s esteemed faculty member Dr. Muhammad Akhyar Farrukh has teamed up with Dr. Haider A. Khwaja from the University at Albany for this initiative. Previous samples indicated an

alarming increase in smog levels, exceeding the limits set by the WHO. These findings underscored the need for ongoing investigation into the causes and disastrous effects of air pollution on the residents of Lahore.

The new phase aims to continue sample collection to further explore the causes of air pollution and potential preventive measures. An added advantage is that the project is funded by the University at Albany, which will open avenues for international research partnerships and provide data-driven solutions to reduce health impacts and improve the well-being of Lahore’s residents.

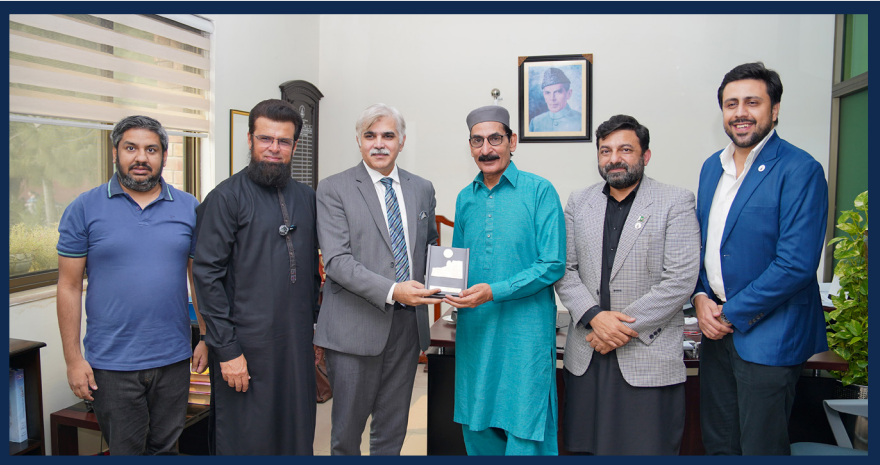
Community Service

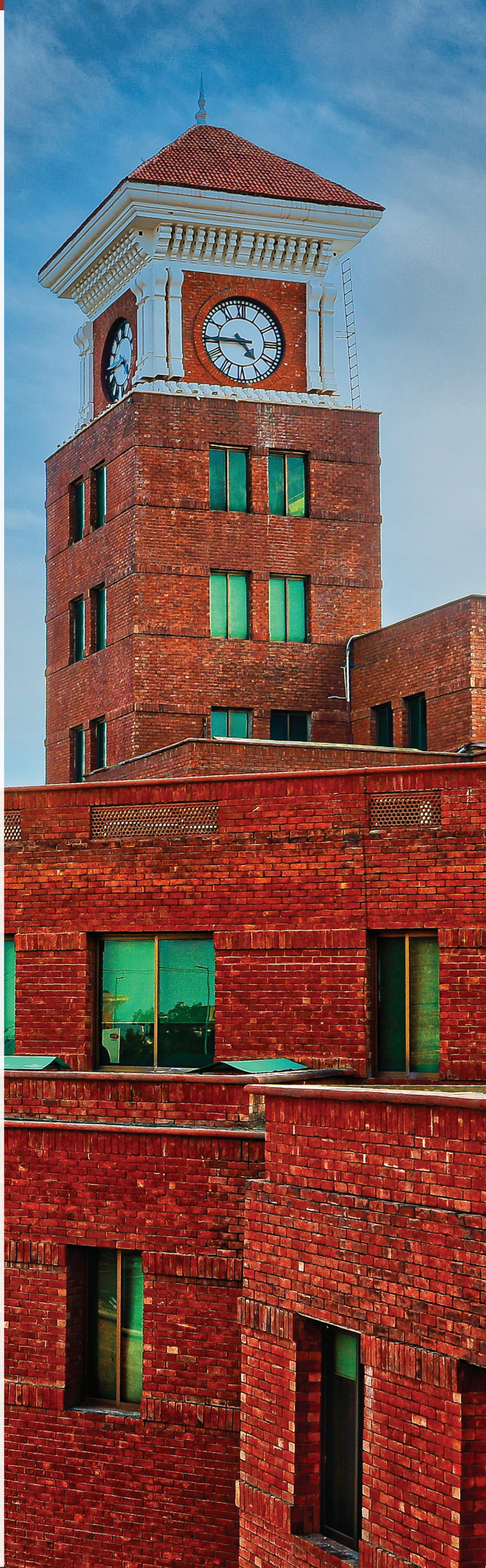
