
Alumni Associations Elections 2025-27


CSO x Ignicube Recruitment Drive


FOHSS x ISSI MOU


UCP x Salford Law School COIL Project




Industry Visits

Berger Paints Delegates' Visit to UCP






FOE hosted PPSC Recruitment Exam






Alumni Relations Office's Fundraising Iftaar



Dr. Muhammad Akhyar Farrukh's Keynote Speech at 3rd ICSTI 2025



IBTIDA UCP x Rizq UCP Chapter Iftaar Drive





In 1666, one of the greatest scientists in history, Sir Isaac Newton, had a moment of inspiration while walking in a garden. He watched an apple fall from a tree and wondered, "Why does the apple always fall straight to the ground? Why doesn't it go sideways or up?" He realized that the Earth must be pulling it down, leading him to the idea of gravity.

This apple story has become a symbol of those "eureka moments" when great ideas suddenly appear. However, many forget that Newton worked on his theory of gravity for nearly 20 years before publishing his groundbreaking book. The falling apple was just the starting point for his long journey of thinking.

The Big Question!

Is Creativity Something You're Born With or Something You Develop?

Creative thinking happens when we make connections between different ideas. But is it something we're born with or something we can improve? In the 1960s, researcher George Land studied 1,600 five-year-olds and found that 98% of them were highly creative. But by age 10, only 30% were still in the highly creative range, and by age 25, just 2% of them scored highly for creativity. As people grow up, they often lose their creativity.

Other studies show a similar trend: even though IQ scores have gone up since 1990, creativity scores have dropped. While some people might be more naturally creative, research suggests that most of our creative skills can be improved with practice.

Intelligence and Creativity

To unlock your creative potential, you don't need to be a genius. You just need to be smart enough and then practice consistently. As long as you have a basic level of intelligence, you can develop your creativity with hard work and dedication. Research has shown that once you meet a certain level of intelligence, your personality traits become more important for creativity.

Growth Mindset and Creativity

A key part of creativity is how we think about our abilities. If you have a fixed mindset, you believe that your talents and skills are unchangeable. But with a growth mindset, you believe you can improve through effort and practice. Carol Dweck, a psychologist, explains that praising effort and persistence, not just talent, helps foster a growth mindset.

For creativity, this means embracing the process, even when you might feel embarrassed or frustrated. It's about being willing to make mistakes and keep going, knowing that failure is part of learning.

How to Be More Creative?


If you're ready to put in the work and face your fears, here are some practical tips to boost your creativity:

- 1. Set limits: Creating constraints can spark creativity. For example, Dr. Seuss wrote his famous book using only 50 words. Limiting yourself can make you more resourceful.
- 2. Write more: Writing regularly, even if it's not perfect, can help you discover great ideas. The more you write, the more likely you are to come across something amazing.
- **3.** Broaden your knowledge: Explore different topics and ideas. The more you learn, the more connections you can make.
- **4.** Sleep well: Good sleep is crucial for creativity. Lack of sleep can reduce your ability to think creatively.
- 5. Spend time in nature: Studies show that spending time outdoors can boost your creativity. Nature and sunlight can help your brain think more creatively.
- **6.** Think positively: Being happy can help you think more broadly and make creative connections. Positive thinking can improve your ability to solve problems and generate new ideas.


7. Keep creating: Creativity is all about hard work. Consistency is key, so commit to making something regularly, even if it's not perfect at first.
