### Youm-e-Tashakkur Flag Hoisting Ceremony



#### Golden Jubilee of Medical Laboratory Professionals Week






### **Faculty Achievements**

Prof. Dr. Muhammad Akhyar Farrukh conducted workshop comprehensive training "Generative Artificial Intelligence in Research, Development" Teaching, and Professional University Engineering of and Technology. The workshop covered strategies for drafting outlines, conducting intelligent searches, understanding academic content, and generating research writing with Al assistance. This was followed by hands-on exploration of GenAI tools in teaching and learning, including course generation, lesson planning, grammar enhancement, paraphrasing, quiz development, and assessment creation. In the post-break session, participants delved into advanced Al-supported instructional design. Topics included revisiting Bloom's Taxonomy through GenAl, formulating learning objectives and outcomes, crafting action plans, and designing modules using AI platforms. The workshop concluded with a critical discussion on ethical frameworks for responsible GenAl integration in academia.

#### Ms. Sadia Zia's Appointment to Board of Directors at Global Health Security Network, Australia



### Prof. Dr. Muhammad Naveed's Participation in Pak-Sri Lanka Faculty Exchange Program




## Prof. Dr. Mahtab Ahmad Khan's Participation as Scientific Session Chair at 1st International Forman Pharmacon 25

#### Department of Physics' Industry Visit to National Centre for Physics (NCP), Islamabad



#### **UCP x NESPAK MoU**






### **Faculty Meetings**

### **EDITORIAL | MAY 2025**
