






Workshops and Seminars

Role of Artificial Intelligence in Facilitating Cross-Linguistic Communication and Bridging Language Barriers







DEX 2025: Design Meets Problem Solving






UCP Students Secured Runners-up Spot in National Seminar & Poster Competition

CSO's Interview Preparation Workshop



FoE x Creative Group MoU





UCP Students Embark on Cultural Journey through Chinese Summer Camp Experience





Exploring the Future of Work at LUMSX Nexus 2025


